### Pastoral Update 23.01.2021

# 1. Online Service this Sunday

# 3. From the Church Meeting

# Staffing Update

The following statement was read to the meeting.

"The Elders and Peter have been aware for some while that Matt and Rachel have felt that the focus of their calling has been changing and they have now accepted a call to work full-time with the Inspire Movement with which they will start their service from 1st May. Matt's service with Cornerstone will end on 18th April and the Elders have agreed that we should free Matt from his Cornerstone duties with immediate effect to release him and Rachel to spend the time between now and the 18th April (the end of Matt's notice period) preparing themselves physically, emotionally and spiritually for the next stage of their journey of faith. We also feel that it is only right that they should remain in the manse during that time.

The Elders and Peter on behalf of the whole church do want to wish Matt and Rachel every success in their new ministry with the Inspire Movement. Many of us will have benefitted from the work Matt has done to establish Inspire bands but also his wider ministry within the church. We also hope that the next few months before Matt takes up his new responsibilities with the Inspire Movement will be a time of refreshing by the Spirit for both Matt and Rachel as they re-focus on their new calling."

I know you'll join with us in wishing Rachel, Matt and Zoe all the very best for the next three months and as they move on, and will join us in continuing to pray for them.

## Leadership Elections

Scott Halligan was elected as an elder, and Chris Dyson and Duncan Stow were reelected as Headingley site leader and Cragg Hill site leader respectively. Tim Hellawell joined the Cragg LT.

Joe Walsh and Liz Mitchell have agreed for their names to go forward for the Headingley LT (Joe is stepping down as an elder) and Liz Chennels for the Cragg LT. These will come to future site meetings.

It's really encouraging that people are stepping forward for leadership positions across the church at this time.

For your information, the elders now are Greg McLeen (Church Sec), Jill Jones, John Pelham, Steve Burras, Barbara Crosse, Scott Halligan, Tim Rowe, and myself as Minister.

### **Budget**

Pete Briggs reported to the meeting on behalf of the finance team (as he does to the elders on a monthly basis). He reported a surplus of over £20,000 for the previous financial year, which is a great encouragement. We agreed a budget for the new financial year. More about this in future updates, but for now I want to thank everyone who has contributed financially to God's work through the church over the past year which has been so uncertain for many. I am deeply grateful.

#### Elders / Deacons

We agreed a proposal that the diaconate would cease as a separate group, with the elders (who are the trustees) and working groups picking up responsibilities for different areas of work. Again, more about this in future pastoral updates. This decision will be reviewed in five months' time.

#### 4. Bedtime Stories

A reminder that Kate Burkett and Spike continue with Bedtime Stories on Zoom this Sunday (24th January) from 6.45pm - 7pm. The Zoom session will also be open slightly earlier from 6.30pm for any families who would like to chat together beforehand. Although the Bible story will be aimed primarily at CBCL tots aged under 5 across our Gatherings, Key Stage 1 children are welcome to join in the fun too!
